Dear Parishioners and Friends,

May the peace of Christ fill your hearts and homes.

We are entering into the climax of Lent, called Holy week. As far as I have learnt, understood and practiced my catholic faith is all about Holy week which is the culmination of God's unconditional love totally expressed on Calvary. Personally to me, Holy week celebration brings more joy and spirituality content than any other celebrations. I used to question myself how God the Father could love me this much so as to offer His only Son for me and for the whole humanity! I always wonder at God's marvelous deeds in my life and in others as He leads us to another Holy Week this year.

Pope Francis, when he announced the year of Mercy (December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016), quoted that "Jesus is the human face of God's mercy." These words will sum up the mystery of Christian faith. Nowhere is this Christian truth more evident than in Jesus' giving of His life out of love and compassion for us. It is the fundamental message of John's Gospel mentioned in John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son..." and the same theme eventually runs throughout the Gospel.

The Holy Week is another week to walk along with Jesus meditatively pondering over His passion, suffering, and death and on the third day joyfully celebrating His Resurrection. It begins solemnly with the triumphant entry into Jerusalem and we are going to join the people of Israel with songs "Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna" on Passion/Palm Sunday.

On **Thursday of the Lord's Supper**, we are going to enact what took place just before His arrest: by washing the feet of His disciples humbly, He showed the example of servanthood and by giving His own body and blood, He instituted the Holy Eucharist.

On Friday of the Passion of the Lord, we are going to passionately gaze our eyes upon the Holy Cross which was heavy for Jesus to carry and on which He hung and died for our sake.

On Holy Saturday, we solemnly and gloriously celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and the Easter Vigil begins at dusk.

Though we are going to encounter a mixture of feelings and emotions throughout the Holy Week, finally it leads us to the Joyful celebration of Easter. So, my dear friends I would like to ask you for prayers for me-your servant and for all the priests of our diocese and other priests who will join our bishop on Monday for the Chrism Mass, renew our promises to the Lord, to the bishop and the community where the Holy Oils will be blessed which will be used in the Church to administer the Sacraments.



I would like to encourage you all to take part in the liturgical celebrations particularly in the *Triduum* celebrations, spending time in Adoration with the Blessed Lord, in the Stations of the Cross on Friday at 11am, the Passions of the Lord at 3pm and in the Easter Vigil at 7.30pm on Saturday.

I wish you all a prayerful Holy Week and a Happy Easter!

May our Blessed Mother pray for us!
