



My Dear Parishioners,

Greetings of joy and peace in the Lord!

It has been a mild winter so far with less snowpack this year and we do not know when the weather will suddenly turn the other way. I assume that you are all doing well and looking forward to spring.

When something is important to us, we are willing to put a lot of effort into getting it right. For example: with regards to tax, by now we have all received our tax receipts, or will be receiving them soon. In the next while we will be busy filing our taxes. We try to take extra time to check whether everything is entered correctly. When I visited home after the pandemic last May, I was advised frequently to check the latest updates of travel guidelines and it is going to be like that for a few more years. When we buy a car or a house, do we just walk through before we finally decide to go for it? Or do we make a study, inquire about the expertise, browse through diligently, and check the options or deals possible and at last make a solid decision to own it? Important things deserve that much attention.

Lenten season for this year starts on February 22, with Ash Wednesday. This season Biblically speaking is the most significant one which leads us to the culmination of the life of our Lord and the salvation. Here comes a thought for all of us: *What are we going to do for Lent?* We, as Catholics, probably have a simple answer: personally speaking, I am going to give up coffee or abstain from meat on Fridays. I would say in my opinion that giving up coffee or something similar is an old tradition. I do not discourage those who think of giving up and practicing other spiritual practices. It has been traditionally followed and it's reminding us what Lent is all about. Remember, it's just a reminder not the end goal of Lent.

The most important characteristic that is mainly focused in Lent is repentance – a time to reflect on all the many ways I have failed to be the Christians we ought to be. Perhaps, I have failed to be a good pastor or a good catholic and it's time to self evaluate. I have hurt others probably by my comments or indifference even in the Church and it is time to correct myself and get connected with my neighbors. It is time to give up my ego, pride, selfishness, gluttony, sloth and fast from gossiping, being judgmental, the desires of flesh and the pleasures of the world etc.

Lenten season is also a time of preparation for the upcoming blessings especially during the Holy Week. The Church encourages its faithful to walk through this season more spiritually with daily Scripture readings, piously walking with our Lord on the way to Calvary – the Stations of the Cross pondering over the Lord's passion and the suffering, praying the Holy Rosary, and attending Holy Mass if possible, often and going frequently for confession and visiting the Blessed Sacrament (there is going to be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in Lent on every Friday from 9am until 12pm).

I would suggest, my dear parishioners, to pray more for the sick, the suffering, the refugees, the marginalized, the poor, the exploited; for those addicted to drugs and those who are in real need of freedom from all sorts of chains of life.

May our gracious God bestow His blessings upon us all throughout this season!
