To take time for a visit, a meal, a cuppa tea/coffee! Offer to bring a senior to Mass who cannot drive. Show your love and care. My loving parishioners and friends,
Peace of Christ be with you! I hope you are all safe and sound and starting to enjoy the summer as the temperature steadily gets warmer.
The Church by its very nature is concerned about the faithful. It tries to particularly focus on different and urgent need of the time. When the youth were drawn towards modernized and secularized world, it was Pope St. John Paul II who initiated the World Youth Day. After a long preparation, the first WYD took place in 1987, in Argentina.
I would like to bring to your attention the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly." Our present Pope Francis, being an elderly person, when the whole world was socially torn apart due to Covid -19 pandemic, announced in January 2021 that the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly would take place annually on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feast of the grandparents of Jesus, Saints Joachim and Anne. "I am with you always" Matthew 28:20 was the theme for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The second-year theme was "In old age they will still bear fruit" Psalm 92:15. "His mercy is from age to age" Luke $1: 50$ is the theme for this year that marks on July 23, the Sunday before the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne.
Friends, as I began my priestly ministry in Canada with my first assignment in Winfield, I was really surprised to see that it was the retired or elderly people who showed up for any voluntary service in the church. They are obliviously the pillars of the parish; they do not mind spending hours helping, and they are providing financially for the needs of the church within their abilities too.
It's more apparent and concrete in our Holy Cross parish family. In general, parishes in our diocese mostly consist of ageing folks except a few young families or more where there are schools.
We are living in a culture where there are care homes for the aged and we all will finally end up there where assisted living and other health care is provided. However, it pains me to see them living alone in a square and wanting for closeness particularly from their children and grandchildren. I am sure that either the faith or values we hold on was passed on to us through our grandparents and our elderly parents. They are often forgotten and we forget this wealth and preserving and passing on the roots.
"His mercy is from age to age" is a fascinating theme for this year which resulted in the visitation of the young Virgin Mary to the elderly Elizabeth Luke 1:39-56. During this visit, both joyfully exchanged God's blessings by acknowledging how God mercifully accompanied them from generation to generation.
Visiting the elderly is one of the important missions of the church. In order to encourage the faithful to visit the elderly the church once again offers a plenary indulgence to mark the third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly on July 23. The indulgence can be received by grandparents, the elderly, and all Catholics who, "motivated by the true spirit of penance and charity," participate in Pope Francis' July 23 Mass in St. Peter's Basilica or another Grandparents' Day celebration, or who visit the elderly.
Those who would like to participate in the indulgence but are unable
 to leave their homes due to sickness, age, or another serious reason, the decree said, can unite themselves spiritually to the celebrations of the day through "offering to the merciful God their prayers, pain, and the
suffering of their lives" while watching the pope's Mass or another celebration on TV or online.


Our grandparents and the elderly, who nourished our own lives, now hunger for our attention, our love; they long for our closeness. You certainly had or have a plan to travel for family reunions or something like that. I would suggest spending some more time with the elderly in your family or in your neighbourhood or one of our parishioners; if possible have a cup of coffee or dinner and a small prayer. I bet that our visit will surely bring joy together with healing as it was between Blessed Mary our Mother and Elizabeth.
